I am more than happy to share some of my observations of changes in my son since enrolling at the school last September. I don't know what the reason(s) are for which you are considering Heritage for your child, but my primary reason was that Matthew (my son) is dyslexic, was struggling in regular school, and was not showing appropriate progress in some core areas. He loves to learn, is a sponge for contextual learning, but was hitting a wall at school. Ironically, I am a teacher who was fully employed in a different jurisdiction (outside Ontario), but we relocated for this school year in order to give Matthew a better learning environment.

Heritage has a very positive environment that deals very openly and directly with put-downs, bullying, and disrespectful behaviour. The classes are very small, and therefore allow the teachers to give my son the support he needs. It is a relief just for starters to find staff who are knowledgeable about different learning styles, and who have the infrastructure and means to support my son without dumbing down the content. He is also enrolled in SMT tutoring, a program that I learned about and began to implement with him even before we moved. It has been very successful so far for him, and has given him progress and confidence in his reading and writing. He is still below "grade level" in both reading and writing, but has shown immense improvement where there had been little to none for the years from K-grade 4. I fully expect that after another year, he will have gained even more ground. His particular reading and writing levels are recognized by his teacher in the form of individualized spelling dictation requirements, and level of writing expected in assignments.

I will stop here, as I am not sure what questions you may have, or whether your child shares the same kinds of needs as my son does, but I invite you to call or email me if you have questions. You could also talk to Matthew if you like... I can't be at all sure whether the school would be right for your child, but I can tell you that this year for my son has been highly successful, and a complete departure and fresh start from his prior school experiences. We credit Heritage for making a huge change in the life of our daughter. Our daughter has attended Heritage since she was in grade five. Before Heritage she attended a public catholic school, and although she was working at grade level, it was with a fairly significant effort, and in addition to her school time, homework time, also took four hours of tutoring a week. From grade one to four, we watched our daughter, who is quite shy and reserved, retreat before our eyes. The school told us that they couldn't provide additional resources for Kaila as she was working at grade level, and that she was unmotivated and we should be more realistic in our expectations of her. She became withdrawn, lost interest in other activities, hated school, began hanging around with the other girls who hated school, and we were at a loss. Even after being diagnosed with dyslexia, the school wasn't able or willing to accommodate her because, after all, she was working at grade level.

Luckily we literally stumbled upon Heritage as another parent from our school moved their daughter there and decided to take a chance, we felt we had little to lose. Our daughter is now an active and motivated student –reading will never be her passion or love, but her capacity to read and write is substantially improved. And, her substantial abilities in math have finally been recognized. The accommodations that Heritage makes for its students are seamless – the kids see and accept the variety of accommodations as part of the normal day. The SMT program, which she just completed really helped her to feel more confident reading, and also more understanding of what she has a harder time with. She now understands that her dyslexia is just one facet of who she is. She is confident, secure in who she is, and very active. Things that were unimaginable for us just a few short years ago, when we had a daughter who was withdrawn, sad and literally, as awful as it is to say, felt that she was stupid.

One of the biggest differences that I see between the public system and Heritage is the teachers – not necessarily the quality, some teachers at my daughters old school were as motivated and keen as the teachers are at Heritage. But, Heritage's small class sizes mean that that the keen and enthusiastic teacher that you meet in September, isn't starting to struggle in November, and exhausted and burned out by February. They continue to look for new ways to motivate and encourage the kids, and the kids continue to be motivated and happy to be at school.

In closing, I regard Heritage as a school that works and lets many children with all sorts of challenges thrive and develop. My Grandfather use to say the best investment for a child is their education. He use to say "You can take it with, it can't be lost or stolen, it helps you secure employment and can help you enjoy so many things throughout your life". With young children in mind, getting a real boast at the outset of their years at school is something parents don't get a second chance at. I think you are very much ahead of many others.
